PORTRAITS OF TERRITORY




If you want to implement the methodological tool Portraits of Territory, but you don't have the box of materials, this document serves as a guide to organize the exercise using things you can easily get near you and at a low cost. The first step is to review the instructions for the exercise here:

If you want to reproduce the exact pieces contained in the box, we include them here. You can use cut paper or another material you have available.




The materials you will need for the exercise are:

- Boards: Two sheets of paper or cardboard. Preferably large (we recommend ¼ sheet size). **PER GROUP**
- A common letter sized sheet of blank paper so that participants can write the meanings associated to their portraits. **PER GROUP**
- A Variety of pieces of different shapes and colors. You can use seeds, stones, cut paper, or pieces from other board games you might have available. In general, any element you have several copies of. It is important that each group has enough materials to depict what they need. **ONE SET PER GROUP**
- Thread, string, or yarn in different colors and lengths. **PER GROUP**
- Colored pencils, markers, pens, or other elements to draw and color.
- The box contains *emoji* pieces with different facial expressions to represent feelings. We recommend you draw the *emojis* on cut paper so the participants in your exercise have the same opportunity. **ONE SET PER GROUP**

The exercise can be carried out with all or some of the materials mentioned. What is important is giving participants the flexibility to express themselves within the format and include all of the elements they deem important for the narrative phase. These are the expressions included in the box. The blank *emoji* allows participants to draw the expressions they need.
